# **IRS Reinstates Tax-Exemption**

I'm very pleased to report that, in a letter dated November 5, the Internal Revenue Service notified us that it has reinstated our exemption from federal income tax. Also, because their decision is retroactive, we owe no back taxes. As reported in the November issue of the MTACA Letter, we sent our new Declaration of Association (and Constitution and other documents) to the IRS in October. This was in order to re-qualify for tax-exempt status, which was lost in May of 2010. They have classified MTACA as a public charity. We have our own Employer Identification Number and will simply file a one-page form online each year, to remain tax-exempt.
