Hello to everyone,

I have yet to relocate fully from Dallas/Fort Worth, Texas where I currently live because my husband graduated from the Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine last year and accepted a residency in Anesthesiology in Little Rock. We bought a house there, and I have yet to build up my studio/teaching career in Little Rock.

I graduated with a Masters in Music in Piano Pedagogy and Music Composition in Southwestern Theological Seminary. My undergraduate degree was in Broadcasting and Piano. I also acquired a Master Certification in producing from Berklee College of Music. I have been teaching for 14 years though I may look young. Before I started teaching in my current job as a full-time Chinese language teacher at a public charter elementary school and part-time piano teacher, I worked as a contemporary worship leader in a Lutheran church for nine years. I also taught Music Appreciation and MIDI (Music Technology classes) in Tarrant County College for two years. Teaching is my main job, but I also have a passion for composing and accompanying. I have written and produced Chinese Christian songs/albums for churches and non-profit organizations.

My philosophy of piano teaching is to develop the musical potentials of each student and inspire all my piano students to enjoy making music of their own. I have 35 piano students at my home studio and am actively participating in piano festivals and contests held locally in the Arlington Music Teacher Association.
